

The Women's Rights Pioneers Monument is a sculpture by Meredith Bergmann donated by Monumental Women


Every time we create Talking Statues, we discuss the collaboration and how it should proceed. We are always responsible for the technology and programming and often take care of the script and actors as well. In these cases, the client approves every step along the way.

In other cases, the client may have suggestions for the writer and actor. For the Women's Rights Pioneers Monument in Central Park by sculptor Meredith Bergmann, featuring Sojourner Truth, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, and Susan B. Anthony, we were contacted by Brenda Berkman from Monumental Women. She already had a scriptwriter and actors lined up, including Jane Alexander, Viola Davis, America Ferrera, Rita Moreno, Zoe Saldana and Meryl Streep. The scriptwriter was Joanne Parrent. In addition to the app, we also produced a short film for Monumental Women about the sculpture and the three women represented on the statue.





WHAT WILL THE STATUE SAY?

History

The most important element is the story that the statue conveys through its dialogue with the listener. It's akin to encountering George Washington on the street and asking him to recount his life's achievements. The narrative approach can be crafted in various ways; one might choose to present it chronologically or, alternatively, thematically.

Artwork

The statue can also relate to the artwork. The depicted figure might be proud to have a statue placed in this particular location. Alternatively, the statue might have undergone maintenance and looks more polished, or conversely, there might be missing elements that have been lost over time.

Humor

Incorporating humor is essential. The statue can refer to contemporary events even though the person it represents has been dead for more than 200 years. For example, Washington's statue with a raised hand might humorously clarify that he isn't trying to hail a taxi but is signaling his troops.

Authenticity

The tone should be conversational, and there are various ways to achieve this. If the person portrayed is available, they can lend their voice to the statue. Otherwise, a scriptwriter and actor are often used. Quotations can enhance authenticity, but a skilled actor can effectively convey the illusion. In Boston, MA, well-known contemporary women politicians Mayor Michelle Wu, Massachusetts Attorney General Andrea Campbell and US Representative Ayanna Presley lent their voices to the Boston Women's Memorial celebrating women's rights.




